



Author Guidelines for the Preparation and Submission of the Extended Abstract

All submitted extended abstracts should report original and previously unpublished research results. The manuscript must be written in English. Authors may use either American or British English, but the chosen style should be used consistently throughout the manuscript. All non-English words should be italicized. All abbreviations should be written in full when they first appear in the manuscript. SI units should be used.

Manuscript Format

- i. The length of the paper should not exceed 5 pages including tables, figures, references and appendices.
- ii. The manuscript should be typed in single-line spacing.
- iii. Margins (left, right, top and bottom) should be 2.5 cm.
- iv. Text should be justified, except for the manuscript title and affiliation.
- v. Text should be- font: Times New Roman; size: 12, except for the heading.
- vi. All pages should be numbered sequentially using Arabic numerals at the bottom center. Tables or figures must be in MS Excel compatible format.
- vii. Submit your paper as an electronic file written in a Microsoft Word document (DOC, DOCX).

The abstract should consist of 250–300 words written as a single paragraph. It should clearly state the research objective, methodology, major findings, and conclusions. References should not be cited in the abstract.

Introduction (Times New Roman, 13, Bold, Capitalize Each Word, Left Alignment)

State the objectives of the work and provide an adequate background. Avoid an extensive literature review or a summary of the results.

Materials and Methods (Times New Roman, 13, Bold, Capitalize Each Word, Left Alignment)

Provide sufficient details about the methodology used to carry out the research. Previously published methods should be cited appropriately, and only relevant modifications should be described.

Results and Discussion (Times New Roman, 13, Bold, Capitalize Each Word, Left Alignment)

Results should be clear and concise. This section should explore the significance of the results of the work and should not contain extensive repetition of the results. The findings could be discussed in relation to previously published work.

Conclusions (Times New Roman, 13, Bold, Capitalize Each Word, Left Alignment)

The main conclusions of the study should be presented in a concise conclusion section. This section may stand alone or be included as a subsection of the Results and Discussion section.

Sub-Titles (if any) (Times New Roman, 12, Italic, Left Alignment)

It should be described with sufficient detail of the contents. (Font: Times New Roman; size:12; Justify alignment)

Acknowledgments (Times New Roman, 13, Bold, Capitalize Each Word, Left Alignment)

All acknowledgments (if any) should be included at the very end of the paper before the references and may include funding sources, institutional support, technical assistance, or other contributions.

Reference (Times New Roman, 13, Bold, Capitalize Each Word, Left Alignment)

References should be prepared according to the Harvard referencing style. (Font: Times New Roman; size:12; Justify alignment)

Tables and Figures (TimesNewRoman, 12, Bold, Capitalize Each Word)

Present tables and figures at the appropriate place within the text, and not at the end of the manuscript.

Tables and figures should be numbered sequentially using Arabic numbers.

The title of tables should be self-explanatory and placed above the tables.

Tables should not contain any vertical lines.

Figures should be numbered sequentially using Arabic numbers and be accompanied with a self-explanatory caption placed below the Figure.
